Event Description Pleasure driving with any type of horse or pony with any type of sleigh, cutter, or sled on the expansive, flat polo field of the Chagrin Valley Hunt Club in Gates Mills, Ohio. Horses and drivers to arrive between 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. Friendly competition begins at noon. No city drive or cross country drive.

<u>Location</u> The polo field is located on the southwest corner of Epping Road and Main Street in the Village of Gates Mills, Ohio. No GPS address for the polo field is available. The address of the Chagrin Valley Hunt Club clubhouse is 7620 Old Mill Road, Gates Mills, Ohio. (The event is not being held at the Cleveland Metroparks polo field in Moreland Hills, Ohio.)

<u>Directions</u> From I-271, Exit at Route 322 East (Mayfield Road). Continue east on Route 322 through the City of Mayfield Heights. Pass Route 91 and Hillcrest Hospital. Turn right (south) on West Hill Drive. Turn immediately left on Old Mill Road. Proceed on Old Mill Road for 1 mile. Turn right on Epping Road.

<u>Parking</u> Trucks and trailers park on Epping Road <u>adjacent to the polo field</u> by direction of the Gates Mills Police. All others park along Epping Road. (Chagrin Valley Hunt Club members may also park in club lots.)

<u>Entry Fees</u> No entry fees. Lunch at clubhouse \$25 with cash bar <u>with reservation</u> by Wednesday, February 19, to Chagrin Valley Hunt Club 440-423-4414.

Judging Friendly competition in a non-sanctioned event. Class awards.

Stabling Day and overnight stabling is available at the Chagrin Valley Hunt Club Stables. \$50/stall includes bedding, labor, and buckets. Bring your own hay and grain. Reservations to Chantel Van Dyne 561-596-6968. Out-of-state horses require proof of a negative Coggins test.

<u>Spectators</u> Spectators, navigators, and grooms are welcome! Please dress for the weather and bring a chair. Hand warmers and foot warmers are recommended. (Can be purchased at sporting goods stores.)

Class Specifications*

1. Ladies to Drive; 2. Gentlemen to Drive

To be shown at the walk and working trot. To be judged on way of going, apparent ability to give a pleasure drive, and manners. Sleigh and harness to be safe and well fitted.

3. Currier and Ives

To be shown at the walk and working trot. To be judged on costumes and general impression. Period appointments to count.

4. Timed Obstacles

Drivers must pass through starting line, proceed through cones, and return through finish line. Cantering is not permitted. Breaks into canter penalized by five seconds.

5. Drive and Ride

Single horse to be driven first way of field at the walk and working trot then unharnessed. (Headers and grooms encouraged.) Horse saddled and ridden second way of field at walk, trot, and canter or lope. Reinback. To be judged on performance, way of going, and manners both in harness and under saddle. (Driver and rider do not have to be the same person.)
